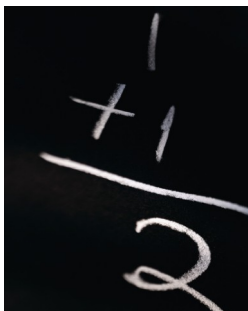

Dear Parent/Guardian,

Hiring high quality teachers is a priority at our school. Through federal law, you have the right to information about the professional qualifications of teachers and paraprofessionals at our school. We wish to share that with you.

To be “highly qualified” under federal law, teachers must:

1. have a state teaching certificate or license
2. have a bachelor’s degree, AND
3. for “new”:
 1. elementary teachers, pass a rigorous test
 2. middle/senior high teachers, pass a rigorous test or have major/coursework
4. for “not new” teachers, pass a rigorous test, major/coursework, or state evaluation
5. Paraprofessionals required to have Paraprofessional certificate

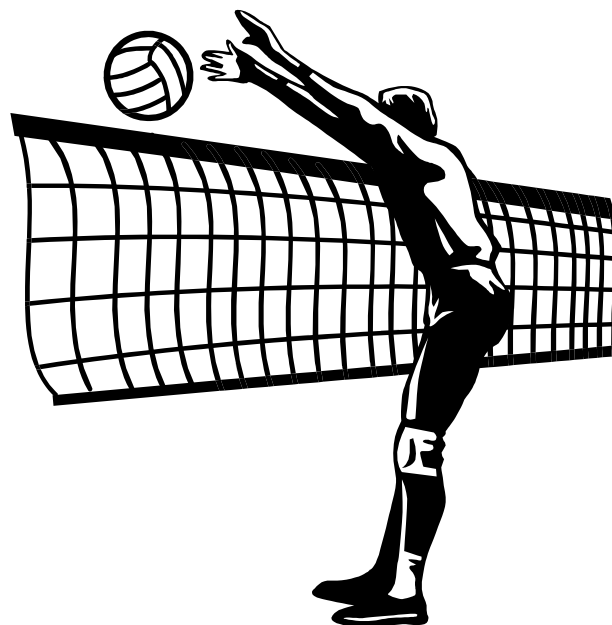

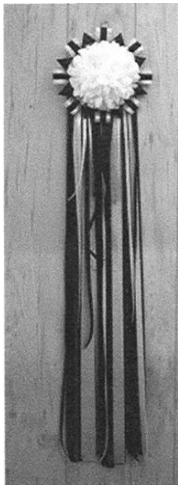

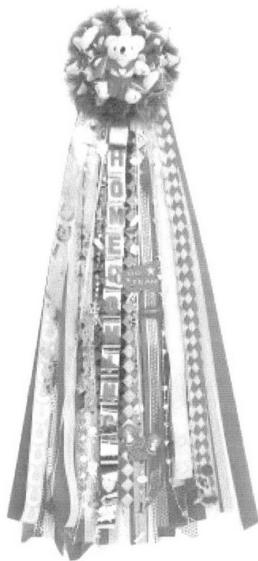
Example of a basic mum before customization — \$25

ASVAB: The Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery will be given to **juniors** in our school the morning of **September 20th**. The ASVAB Career Exploration Program is the most highly regarded and most widely used career exploration program in the world. It is a federally funded program offered free of charge to all high school students; however, those who participate in it have absolutely no obligation to the military. When the ASVAB results come back, Mrs. Zavada will meet with the students to help them complete an interest inventory, look at the information they have obtained about their skills, and help them explore over 400 occupations.

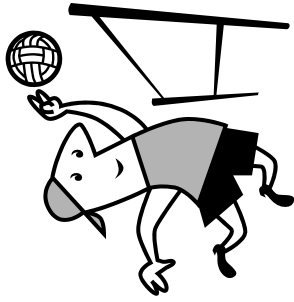
